 Fit, Healthy stock – Committee required to have experienced nominated person to assess stock prior to trial. Eg: temperament, blindness, lameness. Stock to be broken in and not presented for triallers to break cattle in at a trial. Volunteers and Judges – Required to sign a sheet prior to trial starting. Is there a fee required for volunteers so they are covered under the Insurance if an Incident or Accident occurs. Is there an age limit on volunteers to be working at trials? 8. Score Sheets to also be sent to Point Score Secretary along with Results Sheet. Submitted by Janelle Wooldridge I am concerned that some organisers are still not fully aware of the accuracy required when it comes to allocating points to those that receive placings. On two occasions now I have had to explain that the number of triallers in the event are only those that have competed. If for example a trial concludes and the Organiser counts just the number of participants on the draw as the number that competed and has not deducted the ones that did not run then there can be a big difference in the scoring of points and could disadvantage or even corrupt the End of Year Awards.

Rewrite all above Rules to become one rule <u>**Put to**</u> <u>**Vote**</u> if Triallers are prepared to try the Following for a 12-month trial:

• Competitors with one dog in each round arriving late with genuine reason can go to the end of the round.

Not all trailers can be flexible in their work environment. They may have small children, flat tyre, sheep get out on their way back to the trial or something may come up. We don't want people risking their lives for a hard and fast rule, especially when we only have approx. 150 members. It is not like we have 7000 members like ABCRA. Why can't we show compassion for our small number of triallers.

Some local triallers or those not camping cannot stay late into the night due to commitments at home or genuinely don't arrive for their run because of miscommunication or unaware of changes. We don't just go to a trial either up to 5 hours away for the day out. It is too expensive and really disappointing if a genuine lateness cannot be given a fair review.

We show leniency for volunteers, judges when they are running in a sheep trial or they have a run in a campdraft (Rule 84 and 89). Should we not show leniency for others, eg sponsors, cattle donors, truck drivers, triallers that just jump in to help etc.

11	Which brings me to this point, if I asked to be a volunteer at each trial, does that make me exempt from losing my run? I can recall a trialler waiting for a Judge to have two runs in a sheep trial before the cattle trial could resume. It was late in the evening at the end of the trial. Please note Rule 98 has had its trial for 12 months. It is now time to try a different idea! Not happy Jan.	Dor
